

# **#4 Reconciled to God!**

Colossians 1:20-23

# THE WORK OF CHRIST: TURNING ENEMIES INTO ERIENDS!

Colossians 1:19 For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, <sup>20</sup>and through him to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, making peace by the blood of his cross. <sup>21</sup>And you, who once were alienated and hostile in mind, doing evil deeds, <sup>22</sup>he has now reconciled in his body of flesh by his death, in order to present you holy and blameless and above reproach before him, <sup>23</sup>if indeed you continue in the faith, stable and steadfast, not shifting from the hope of the gospel that you heard, which has been proclaimed in all creation under heaven, and of which I, Paul, became a minister.

#### THE MULTI-FACETED WORK OF SALVATION

Regeneration: the sinner stands before God spiritually dead, but is infused with the very **LIFE** of God – *Ephesians 2:5* 

<u>Justification</u>: the sinner stands before God as the accused, but is declared <u>RIGHTEOUS</u> – Romans 5:1

Forgiveness: the sinner stands before God as a debtor, but the debt

is completely **PAID OFF** and forgotten – *Ephesians 1:7* 

<u>Adoption</u>: the sinner stands before God as a stranger, but is made a **SON** – *Ephesians* 1:5

Redemption: the sinner stands before God as a slave, but is granted

**FREEDOM** by the payment of a ransom – Colossians 1:14

Reconciliation: the sinner stands before God as an enemy, but is

declared to be a FRIEND - Romans 5:10

# PREEMINENCE PRINCIPLE #4:

Putting Jesus First begins with being reconciled to Him through faith

# CHRIST'S WORK OF RECONCILIATION

# 1. THE PLAN OF RECONCILIATION

<u>Colossians 1:19</u> For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, <sup>20</sup> and through him <u>to reconcile to himself all things</u>, whether on earth or in heaven, making peace by the blood of his cross. <sup>21</sup>And you, who once were alienated and hostile in mind, doing evil deeds, <sup>22</sup> <u>he has now reconciled in his body of flesh by his death...</u>

# 2. THE MEDIATOR OF RECONCILIATION

"making peace by the blood of His cross"

"He has now reconciled in his body of death by his flesh"

<u>1 Timothy 2:5</u> For there is one God, and there is one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus.

# 3. THE PURPOSE OF RECONCILIATION

<u>Colossians 1:22</u> ... in order to present you holy and blameless and above reproach before him...

<u>Ephesians 5:25</u> Husbands, love your wives, as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her, <sup>26</sup>that he might sanctify her, having cleansed her by the washing of water with the word, <sup>27</sup>so that he might present the church to himself in splendor, without spot or wrinkle or any such thing, that she might be holy and without blemish.

# 4. THE EVIDENCE OF RECONCILIATION

<u>Colossians 1:22</u> he has now reconciled in his body of flesh by his death, in order to present you holy and blameless and above reproach before him, <sup>23</sup>if indeed you continue in the faith, stable and steadfast, not shifting from the hope of the gospel that you heard, which has been proclaimed in all creation under heaven, and of which I, Paul, became a minister.
